Pastoral Transition Overview

This article is to help us understand the process as we move toward Pastor Tom's retirement on February 14, 2021. One of the key terms you will be hearing about is an Interim Pastor. Often people ask, "Why use an Interim Pastor?" The following quote from our Presbytery Executive, Dan Williams, helps explain why:

"An Interim Pastor is a person **trained in transitional ministry**, helping a congregation move into a new chapter of its life. After a long pastoral tenure, as in FPC of Mount Dora's case, in excess of 30 years, an interim can help a congregation prepare for new directions while avoiding the pitfalls that can lead to the next pastor being an 'unintentional interim.'" The Rev. Dr. Williams goes on to say: "There are **5 essential tasks of transitional ministry** [*to be developed in future newsletters*]:

1. Coming to Terms with History
2. Discovering a New Identity
3. Shifts of Power/Leadership Changes
4. Rethinking Denominational Linkages
5. Commitment to New Leadership and to a New Future

"An Interim Pastor brings a fresh set of eyes into a situation and can help the Session and congregation address the above tasks in ways in which they likely would not be able to do on their own. An interim also provides for the consistent continuation of important ministry tasks. The interim can also help the congregation make necessary changes, sometimes 'taking the heat' for these changes so the eventual new pastor will not have to address these issues. These changes may involve programs, mission outreach, or staffing decisions."

"In short, an Interim Pastor provides both continuity in ministry tasks as well as expertise and insight into systemic changes that may need to be made in order to prepare the congregation (in ways it might not be able to recognize otherwise) for the next chapter in its journey," The Rev. Dr. Williams says.

Interim Pastors are "specially trained" for this important task!

Like all pastors, the Interim Pastor will offer to the congregation:

- Worship leadership and preaching
- Pastoral care
- Work with the Session to provide for the life and ministry of the congregation
- Administrative work including supervision of other staff persons
- Staff support for programs and committees of the congregation

A good Interim Pastor will "hit the ground running," beginning his/her time with the congregation with intensity and energy, and will leave with intentionality, engaging in a "good goodbye" with the congregation and its staff. A good interim pastor is fully present with the congregation from the beginning, and really leaves when she/he leaves.

Once the Interim Pastor is in place, the congregation will do a **mission study** (a review of current and future plans for discerning what God is calling us to) and will elect a **Pastor Nominating Committee** to identify our next pastor.

During this transitional time, please be in prayer for Pastor Tom, our Session, our congregation, and our future Pastor Search Committee, and if called to serve on it, prayerfully consider answering the call.


