From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends:

As my second month with you closes, I want to tell you how much I have enjoyed getting to know those of you I have met and I look forward to meeting more of you. You are indeed a good and healthy Church Family and I am privileged to serve God with you.

Several have asked about the process in the search for a new pastor. Let me outline the normal steps that will be taken in the future.

At some point the church will have what is called a mission study to determine what we will look for in the new pastor. This is often done on a Saturday as all members are asked to attend and takes up most of the day. Sometimes a church will conduct the mission study with a survey given to all the members and regular friends of the church.

When the session, the interim pastor, and other leaders in the church agree the time is right, the session will make a request of the Committee On Ministry (COM) of the presbytery to approve us electing a Pulpit Nominating Committee (PNC). When this committee is elected, they will work through a brief training session and the presbytery will assign a liaison from the presbytery to assist them in their process.

The first thing the PNC will do is to fill out a Church Information Form (CIF) that reflects a true picture of the church. When this is completed and the session signs off, it will be sent to the denominational office to be circulated to potential pastors who are looking to relocate. At this point the PNC will begin gathering names of possible candidates.

When the PNC, after viewing numerous Pastor Information Forms (PIFs), determines that one name or several names stand out, they will contact the candidates to determine if they are interested in being considered. This is followed with an interview of the candidate(s) and if all agree, a candidate is put under focus. The candidate and family will be invited to visit the church and the geographical area.

When the PNC feels confident that they have found the proper candidate, they will inform the presbytery who will then do some further research on the candidate to determine that indeed this candidate is a good one.

The next step is for the PNC to call a meeting of the congregation. At that meeting the PNC will present the name and biographical information to the congregation and they will vote on the candidate. If the call of the pastor is approved and the terms of the pastoral call are approved, the candidate will be presented to the presbytery for examination at their next meeting.

When all that is done, a date to begin will be established and both parties will begin the process for the move and the settlement of the pastor and her or his family.

In the meanwhile, I ask you to pray for the church as we go through this process and that God will guide us to determine the right time to proceed and will prepare the pastor for us, that he wants us to have.


